
and expanded the spacing between letters and words. As concerning the column after Mark 16:8 (that is, the third column of Figure 3a), he resumed his normal spacing of letters and words. Why? (And, remember, the **same** scribe wrote Vaticanus and Sinaiticus in this section!)



Let us look at Sinaiticus in Figures 4 and 5 to see this bizarre phenomenon even more closely. Something is just <u>not</u> right about this so-called "independent" "oldest and best" witness—and if its scribe was dishonest, that would make Vaticanus equally liable to doubt (for it was the same scribe). Remember, on page 1078, *Halley's Bible Handbook* praises Sinaiticus for being "the **most precious** writing in existence." Let us see how true it is... literally.
